Pending a study of various senior transportation alternatives available in West Sacramento, the Parks & Recreation Shuttle Shopping and the Community Center Shuttles will be discontinued as of August 29th, 2011. We apologize for any inconvenience this has caused.

The West Sacramento Community Center does offer vouchers to offset the cost for riders who utilize Yolo Bus Special. On the reverse side of this notice is a voucher informational sheet, compliments of BBCAN. Please see Community Center staff for more information.

Also, The Yolo County Transportation District provides local and regional public transit service in West Sacramento. The Transit Center is located directly on the Community Center property for convenient access to bus patrons. # Senior Transportation Voucher Program STVP



## What is the STVP?

The program is for seniors who are no longer driving for safety and medical reasons. It provides alternatives for transportation to medical appointments, grocery stores or other common destinations.

## What does STVP offer?

It offers free transportation throughout West Sacramento and low cost transportation to some areas outside of West Sacramento.

## How much does it cost?

Each free voucher is worth \$3.00 and may be applied to different transportation routes.

- Local (within West Sacramento): fare is one voucher
- Intercity (within Yolo County): fare is one voucher plus \$1.00 cash
- Sacramento (medical appointments only): fare is one voucher plus \$2.00 cash.

**Cash is paid directly to the bus driver.**

## Who can get the vouchers?

You must complete an application to receive a voucher.

Voucher users must be at least 60 years of age and be eligible for YoloBus Special paratransit services.

## What are the requirements for YoloBus Special paratransit services?

Due to a disability or loss of drivers license, you are unable to use YoloBus regular route bus system  
**OR**

Due to a disability, you are unable to travel to a bus stop or wait in inclement weather at the bus stop.

## How can I get a voucher or an application?

## After I qualify, how do I make reservations for a trip?

Reservations are taken daily from 7am to 6pm including holidays

Ride requests must be made one to seven days in advance. Same day rides are occasionally available.

The reservation number is 530-666-2877 (YoloBus Special)

Tell the scheduler if there are special needs, such as traveling with assistive devices or wheelchairs, or if traveling with an attendant.
